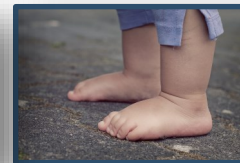
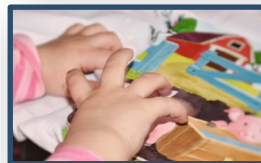
Wiggle Your Fingers
